Major Concerns of the 2025/26 – 2027/28 School Development Cycle

1. Holistic support to enhance students' wellbeing and development

The following are feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

- Class teachers are to be further empowered in nurturing students
- The mental well-being of students and teachers can continue to be strengthened
- More measures for supporting regular physical exercise could be introduced
- Explore a mechanism to timely recognize good behaviors of students
- Homework, assessment policy and school rules are to be reviewed to foster a low-stress and supportive learning environment for students
- Guidelines for LWL lessons to ensure balanced and comprehensive coverage
- Broader territory-wide exposure in the fields of STEAM and social service can be provided to expand students' horizons and unlock their potential
- More in-depth life planning education and support should be provided to students

2. Nurturing a learning community by strengthening students' learning skills and ethical use of technology

- Extend LAC to additional EMI subjects and enrich its contents to sharpen presentations skills and report-writing skills
- Use emerging technologies, including artificial intelligence (AI), to deepen students' self-directed learning, and introduce e-learning user guide and revise related policies
- To students' generic skills, cross-curricular project learning and cross-subject collaboration should be strengthened
- To broaden students' knowledge base and deepen "reading to learn", more subject panels will assign extended reading tasks and enhance collaboration with the teacher librarian to recommend a wider range of quality materials
- Revise assessment policy to strengthen students' readiness for examinations
